
At the Annual Meeting we will outline our plans for the coming year, review our financial position and elect a new Board of Directors to lead the Association's efforts throughout 2020.





STORAGE CAGES

The **LAPD** has some suggestions on enhancing the security of your possessions while in a Tower Basement Storage Unit.

- a. Harden the Target
 - Increase the lighting at the entrance to the Storage Room and within the facility.
 - Provide Surveillance Cameras to record activity in and around the Storage Area.
 - Use Case Harden chains and Hasp Free padlocks to secure your cage.
 - Increase Professional Patrol "Walking Tours" of tower basements especially in the evening / night hours.
 - Visit your Storage Area on a periodic basis to check upon the Security / Safety of your possessions.
- b. High Value Items
 - Jewelry / Important Papers should be stored in a Safe Deposit Box at your bank.
 - Valuable Large Items should be placed in Bonded Storage at a licensed storage facility not in a Basement Storage Cage
- c. Renters Insurance
 - Ensure that your Renters Insurance Policy covers property placed in tower basement storage areas.
