# Spring is coming and we are spending more time outdoors.

### Looking out for each other is important!

At PARK LA BREA Pedestrians always have the Right Of Way. Do Not bicycle or skateboard in tower halls or lobbies. Skateboarding and Bike Riding should always be done Out Of Doors. Within Park La Brea's park areas the dirt paths are for walking only. Park La Brea has many designated bike lanes on property. Bike Riders and Skateboarders must always respect the Rights and Safety of Pedestrians while operating on property.

#### Bike Riders

Ride in the same direction as the Traffic flow. Obey all traffic laws. Always wear your helmet. Use hand signals and keep both hands on the handle bars as much as possible. Utilize bike lanes wherever possible.

#### Skateboarders

Utilize a helmet that is specifically meant for skateboarding and always wear closed shoes. Knee and elbow pads and wrist guards are recommended for skateboarders at all levels of ability. Make sure that wherever you board the area is free of debris. Impaired surfaces contribute to more than half of all skateboard injuries.

#### 3/14 Pee-Wee's Big Adventure (1985) PG


